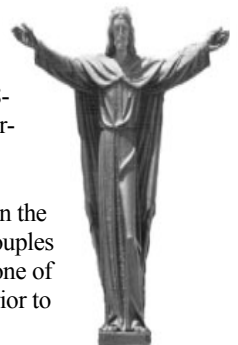

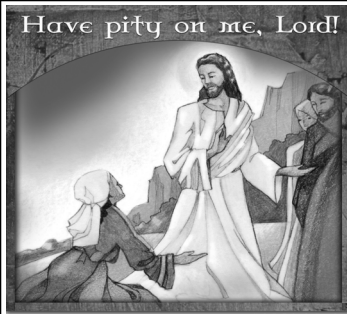

Liturgical Tidbits

CALLED TO ACT IN GOD'S NAME

"Let all the nations praise you!" (Psalm 67:4) today's psalm response exclaims. In the psalms and other Hebrew scriptures, this kind of invocation is actually an invitation to God to act, to intervene in human lives in a manner that will cause everyone—not just the Chosen People—to give praise. Stated a bit more strongly, it is something of a "put up or shut up" challenge to God, the sort of strong statement the psalmists of Israel, trusting in their intimate and loving relationship with God, were not afraid to make. The Gospel has its own exclamation, announcing the appearance of the Canaanite woman with "Behold!" (Matthew 15:22) "Behold!" is a scriptural flag that tells us that God is about to act or announce something through an individual or a situation. In the case of Jesus, God was going to act through this woman, whom nobody among Jesus' followers would have believed to be an agent of the divine will. Like the psalmists, we might passively inform or perhaps even actively challenge God to do something so that everyone will come to belief, but God will always turn the tables on us. It becomes our calling, our duty (as it was for Jesus) to behold the situations and persons of our daily lives so that God can act through us, so the Kingdom can be announced through our living.

The first meeting of the Society in the United States was held on November 20, 1845, only twelve years after its foundation in Paris.

SAINTS & SPECIAL OBSERVANCE OF THE WEEK

Mon, Aug 21: St. Pius X, Pope.

Pius X, died August 20, 1914; undertook liturgical and canonical reforms, especially communion for children and frequent communion for adults; condemned Modernism in *Lamentabili* and *Pascendi dominici gregis* (1907); wished to "renew all things in Christ"; patron of sick pilgrims.

Tues, Aug 22: The Queenship of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

This memorial, prescribed in 1954 by Pope Pius, XII for May 31, is now fittingly celebrated on the octave of the Assumption.

Wed, Aug 23: St. Rose of Lima, Virgin.

Isabel Flores de Oliva, died 1617 at age thirty-one; Peruvian mystic; nicknamed "Rosa" because of her beauty; O.P. tertiary who lived a life of penance and solitude, caring for the homeless, elderly, and sick; first declared saint of the New World (1672); patroness of the Philippines, South America, Peru, florists and gardeners.

Thurs, Aug 24: St. Bartholomew, Apostle.

Bartholomew, died 1st c.; probably a surname in the synoptic gospels, meaning "son of Tolmai"; known as Nathaniel in John's gospel; associated with Philip; said to have preached the gospel in India and Armenia where, according to tradition, he was flayed alive.

Fri, Aug 25: St. Louis of France; St. Joseph Calasanz, Priest.

Louis, IX of France, died 1270; model ruler and father of eleven children; Franciscan tertiary who cared especially for lepers; built Sainte Chapelle as a reliquary for the crown of thorns; while on his second crusade, died of the plague near Tunis; patron of masons and sculptors.

Joseph Calasanz, died 1648; from Aragon; founded (1617) Clerics Regular of Religious Schools (Piarists), today numbering some 1,375 religious; dedicated to helping poor children; faced many trials and calumnies for his work, including the temporary suppression of his Institute.
